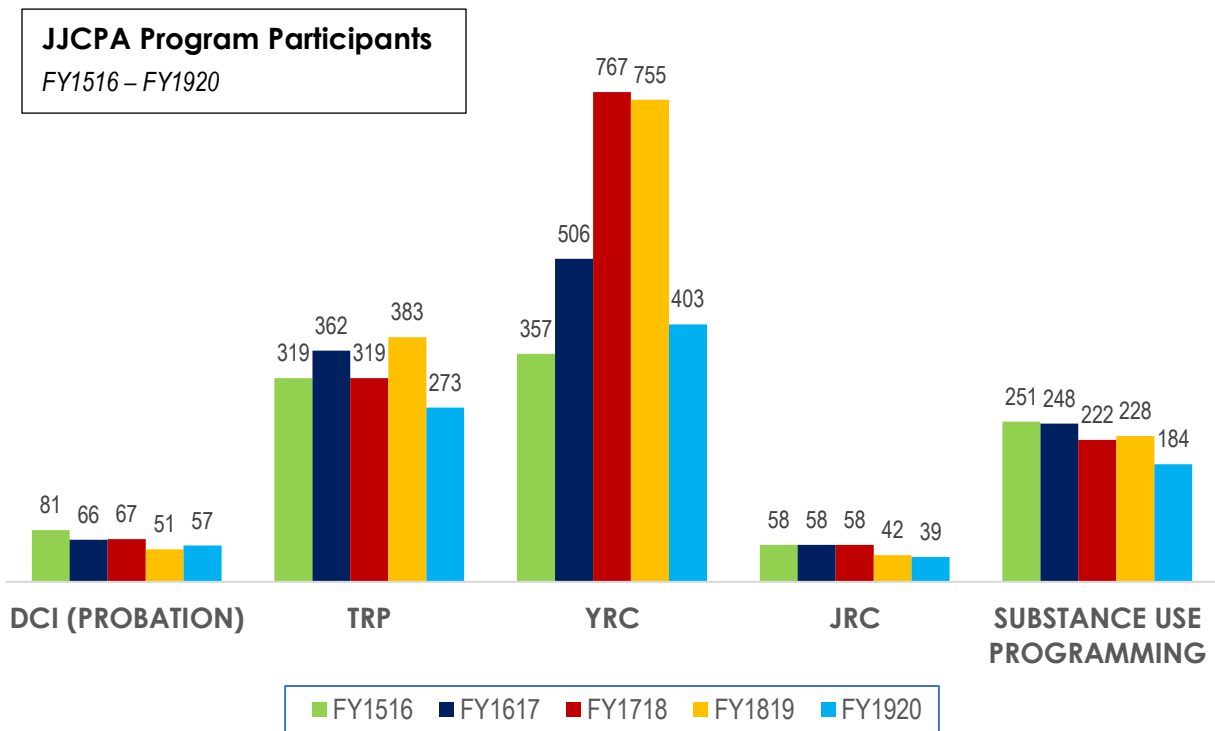

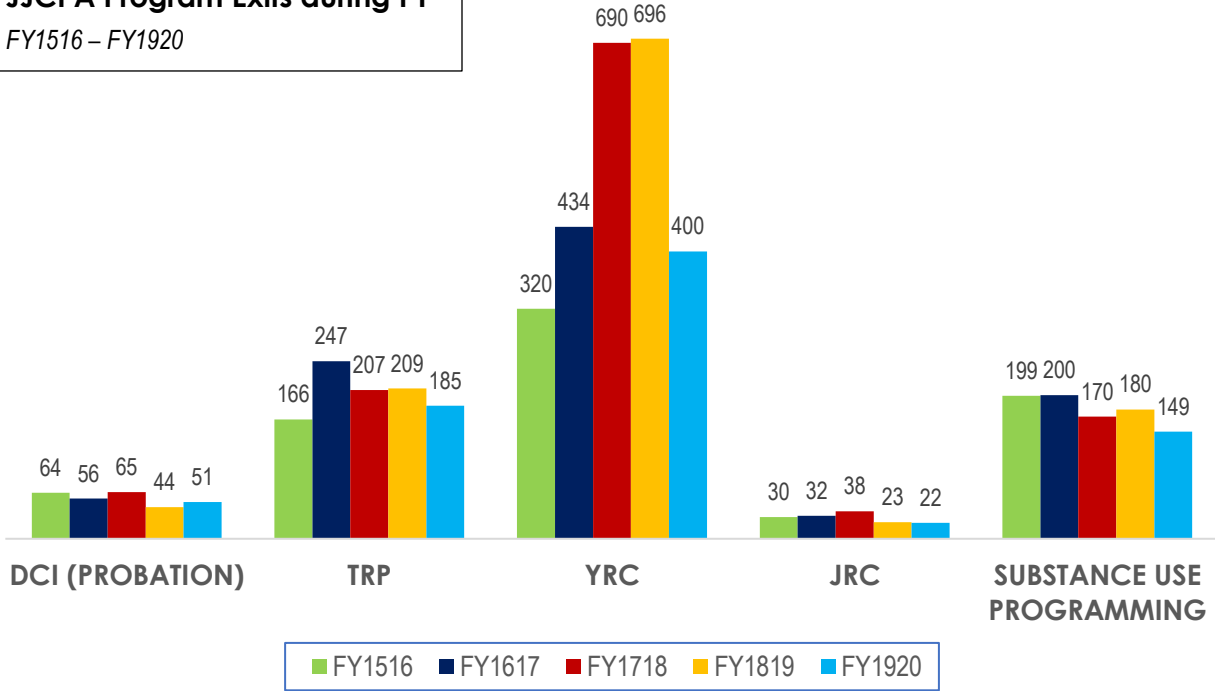

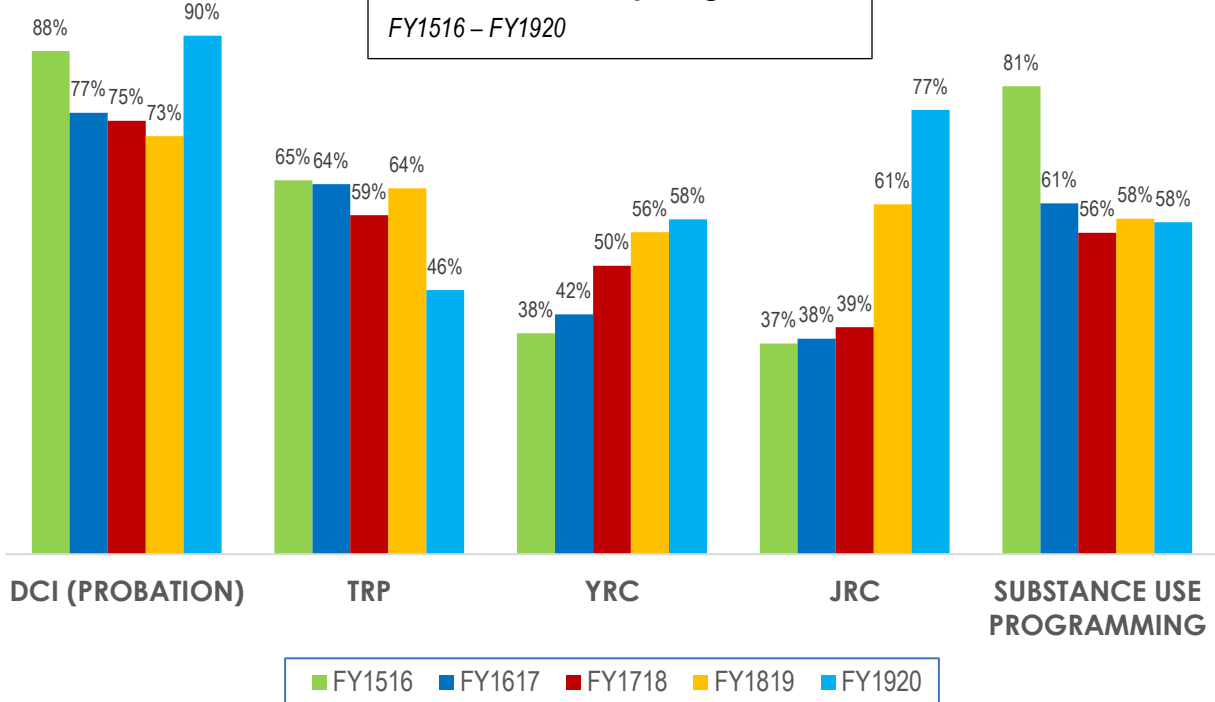

FY1516 – FY1920

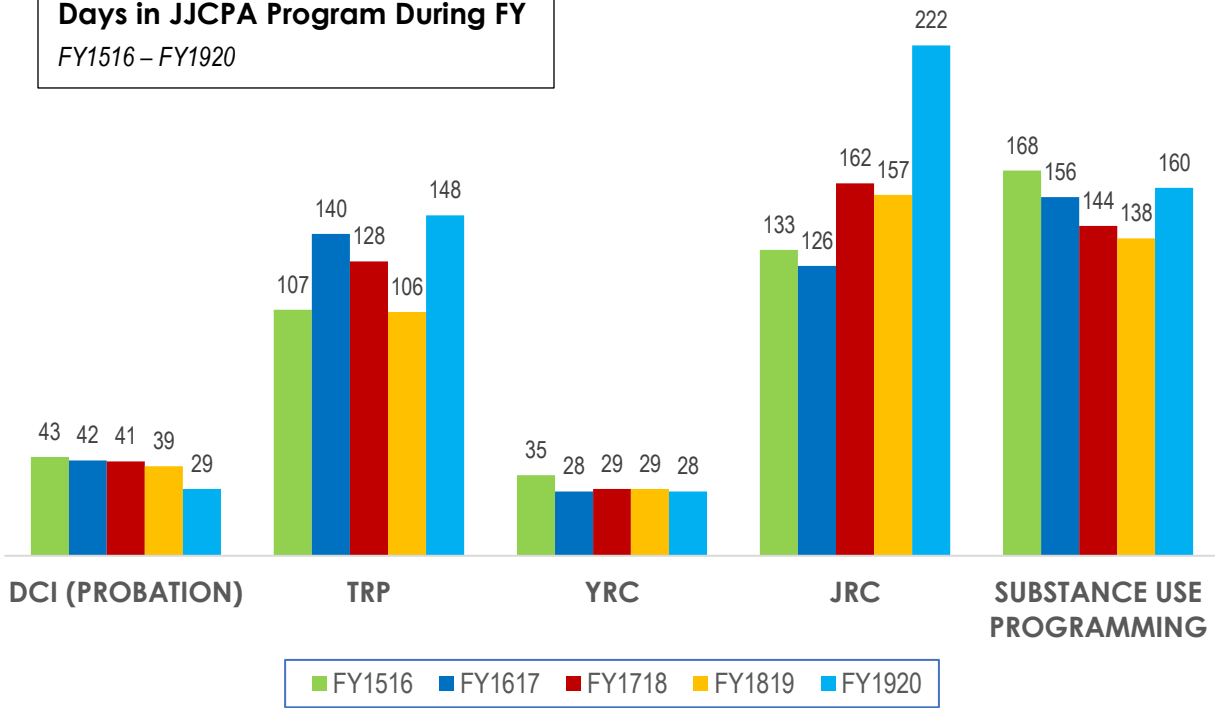


JJCPA Satisfactory Program Exits
FY1516 – FY1920



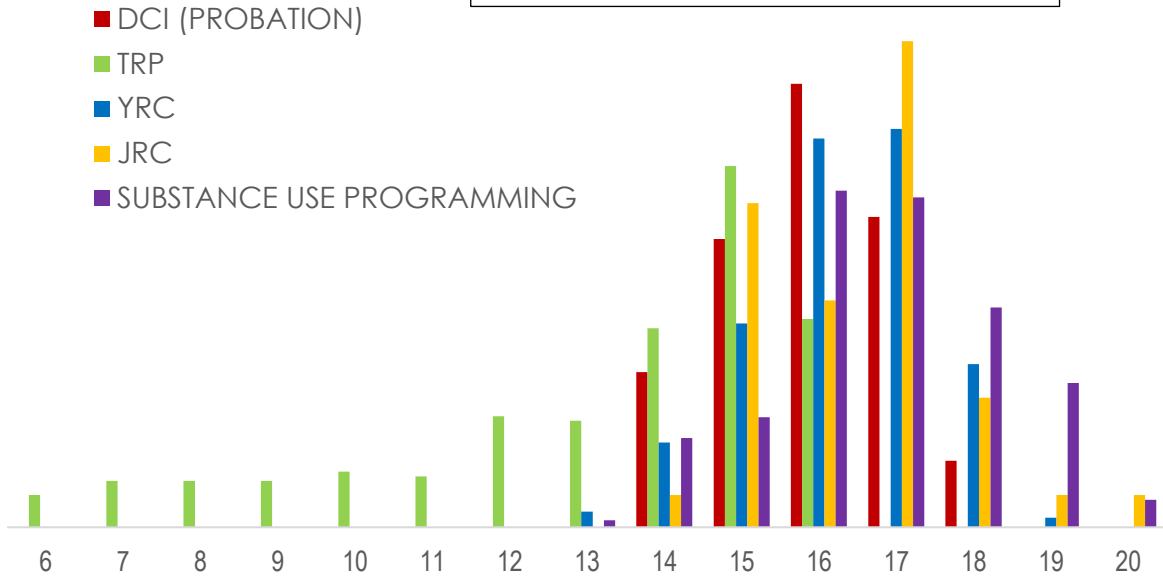
Days in JJCPA Program During FY

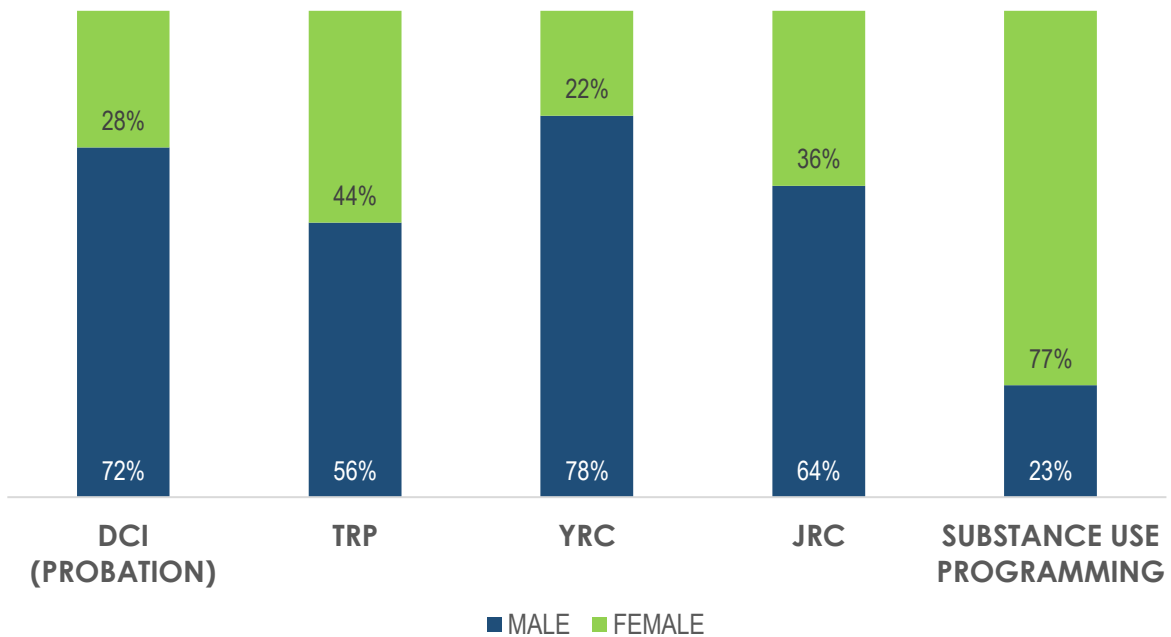
Age of JJCPA Program Participants at Program Entry (in years)

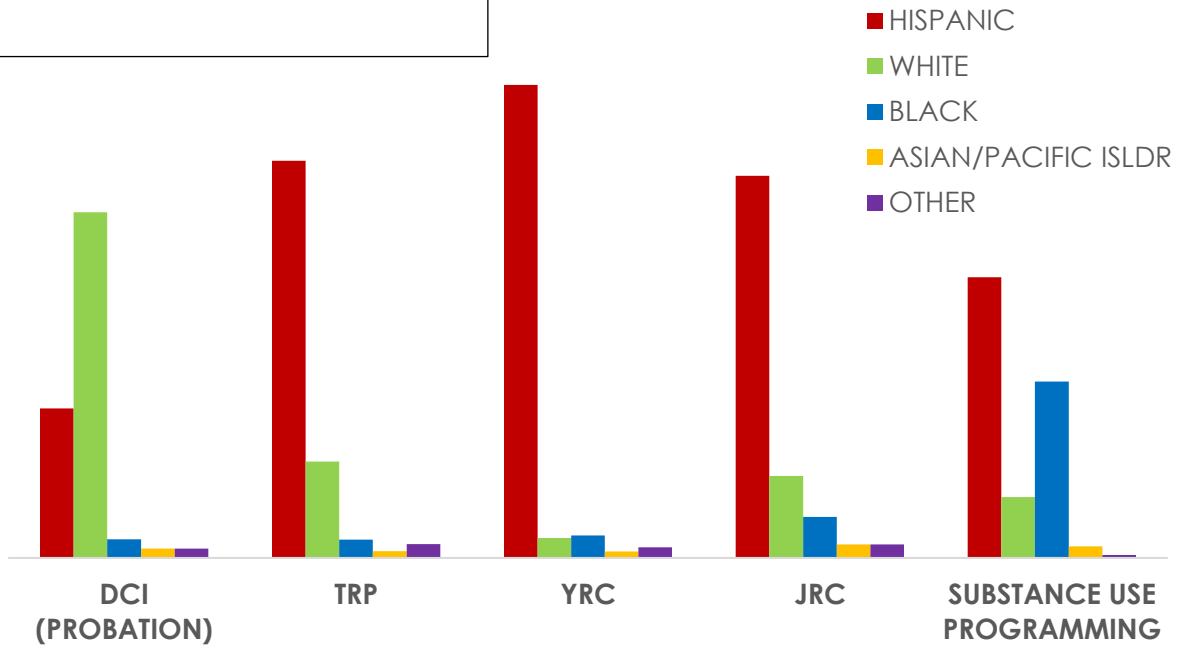
Gender of JJCPA Program Participants

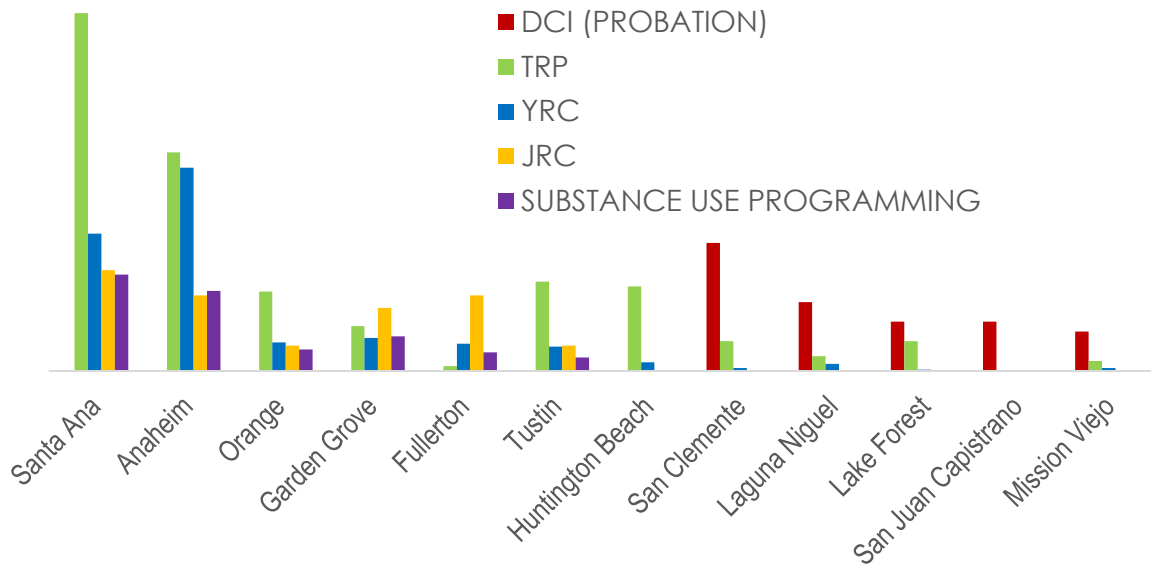
Ethnicity of JJCPA Program Participants

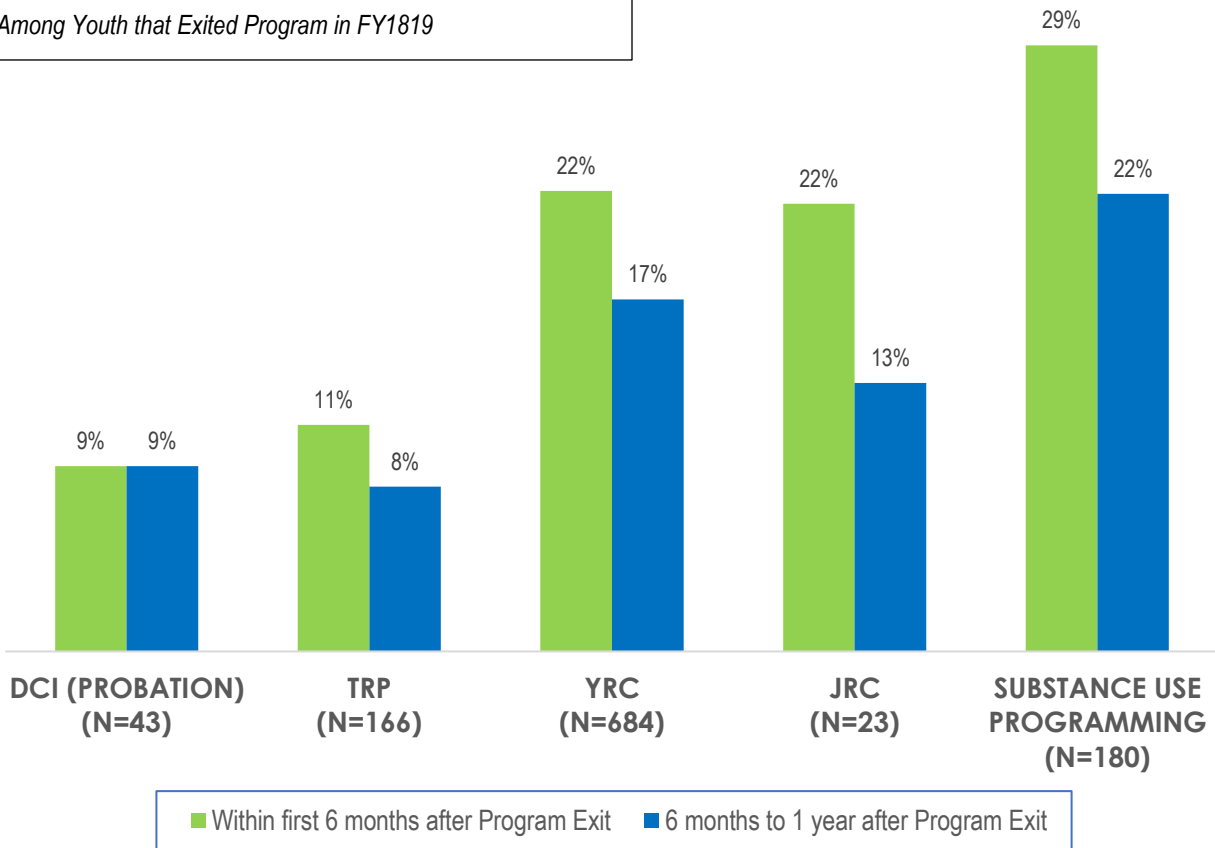
Top Cities of Residence of JJCPA Program Participants
