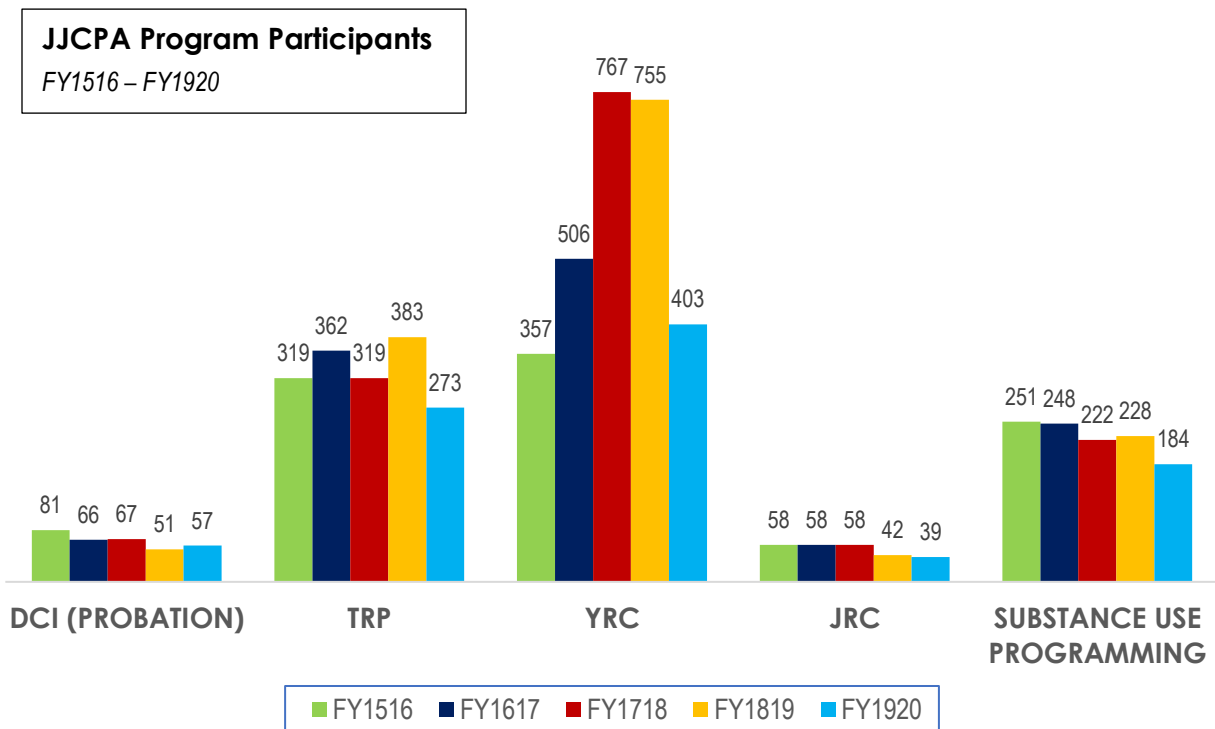
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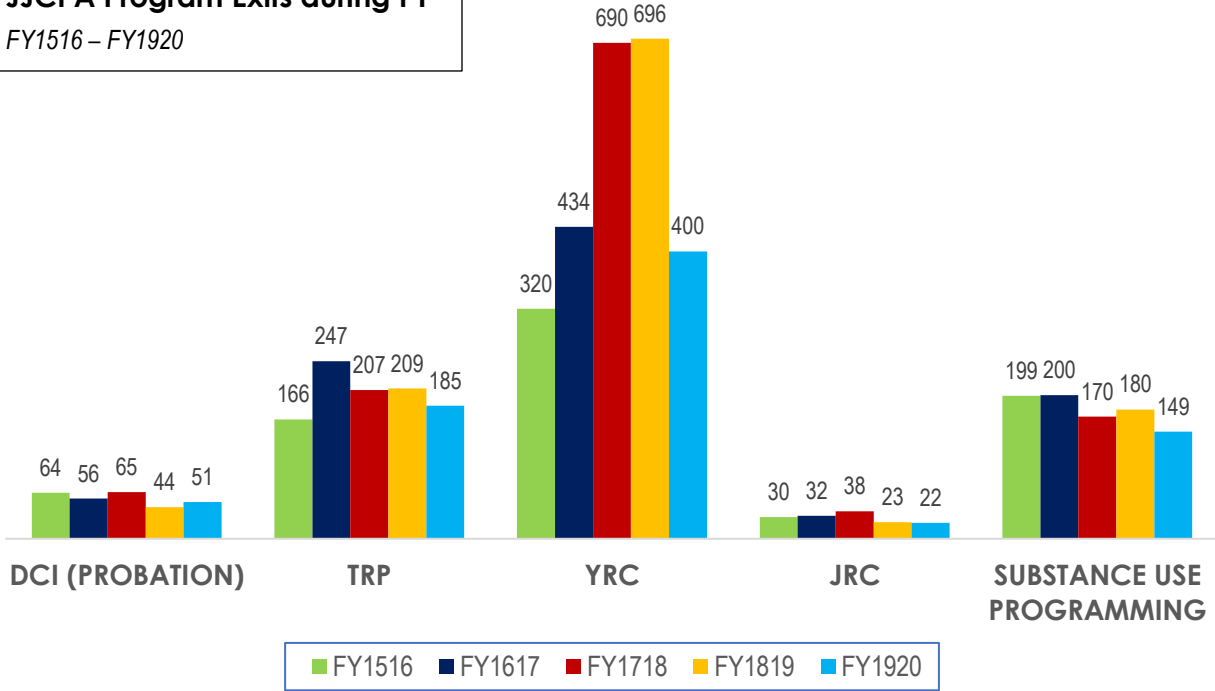

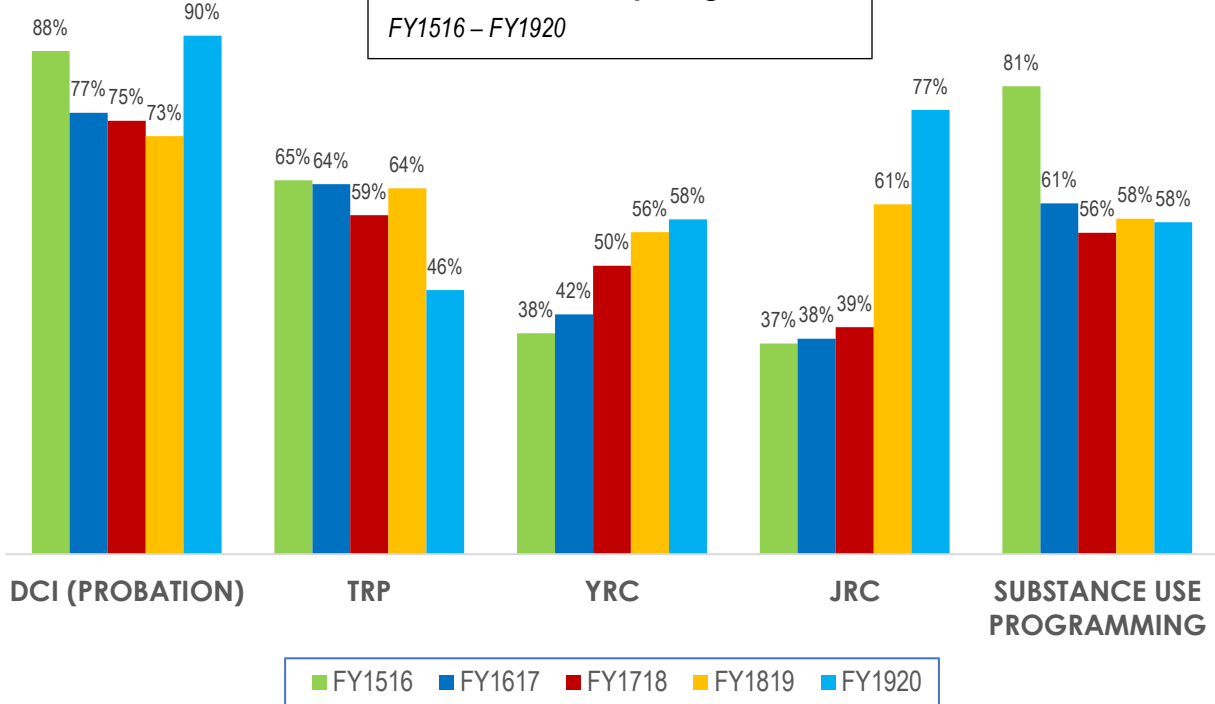

FY1516 – FY1920

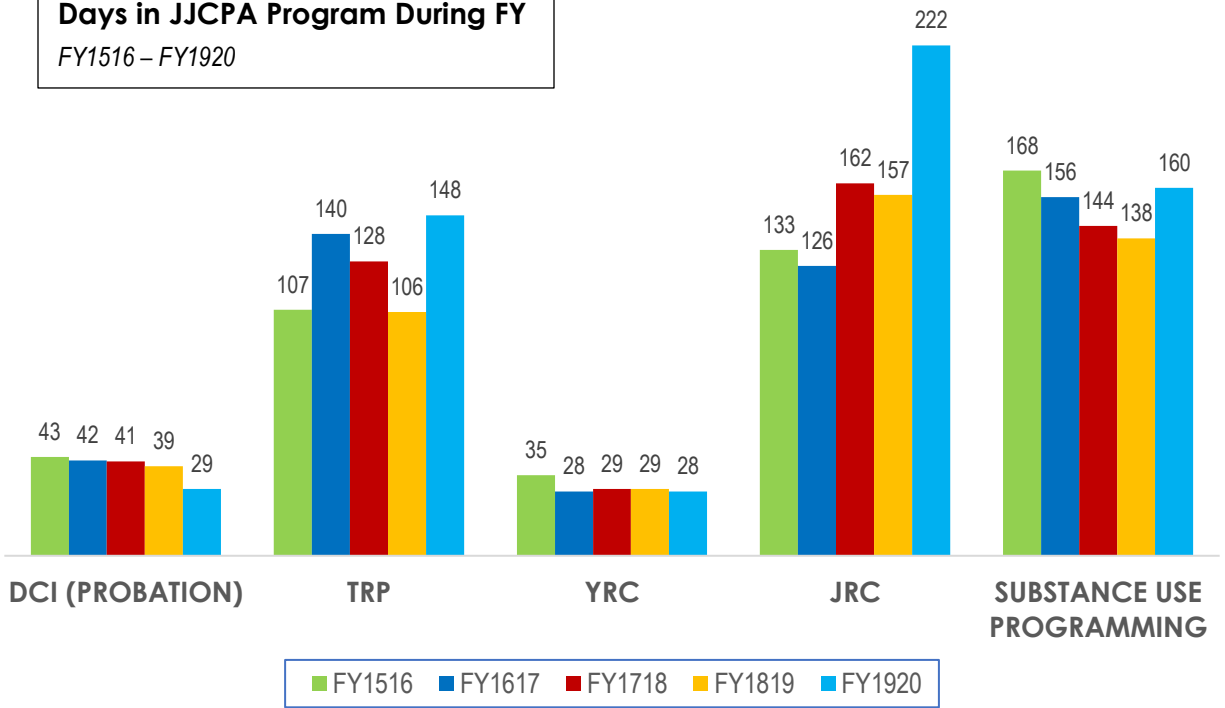


**JJCPA Satisfactory Program Exits**  
FY1516 – FY1920



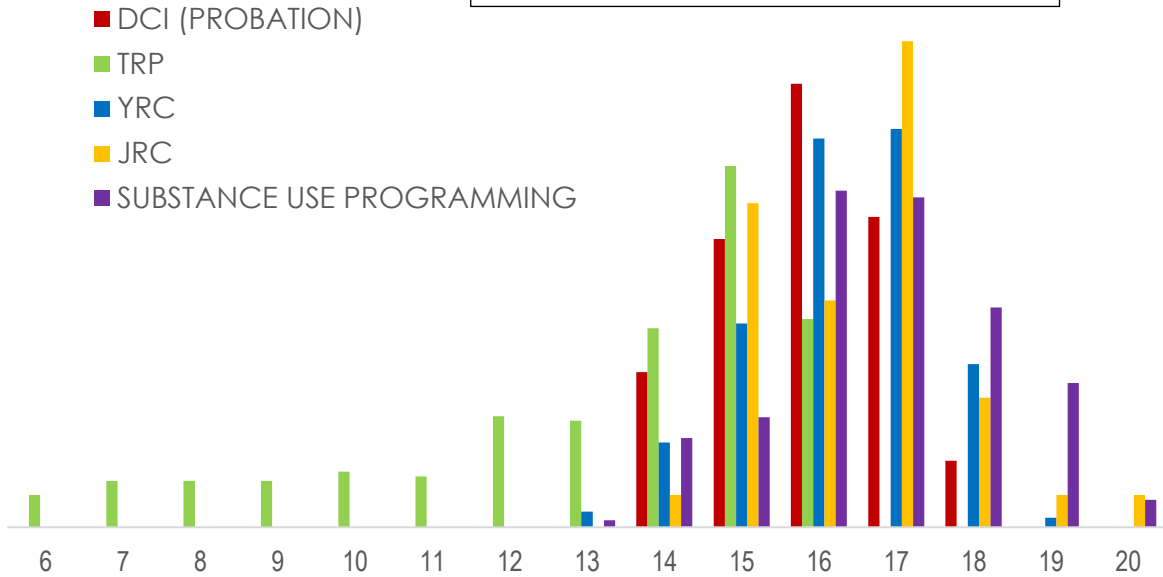
**Days in JJCPA Program During FY**

*FY1516 – FY1920*



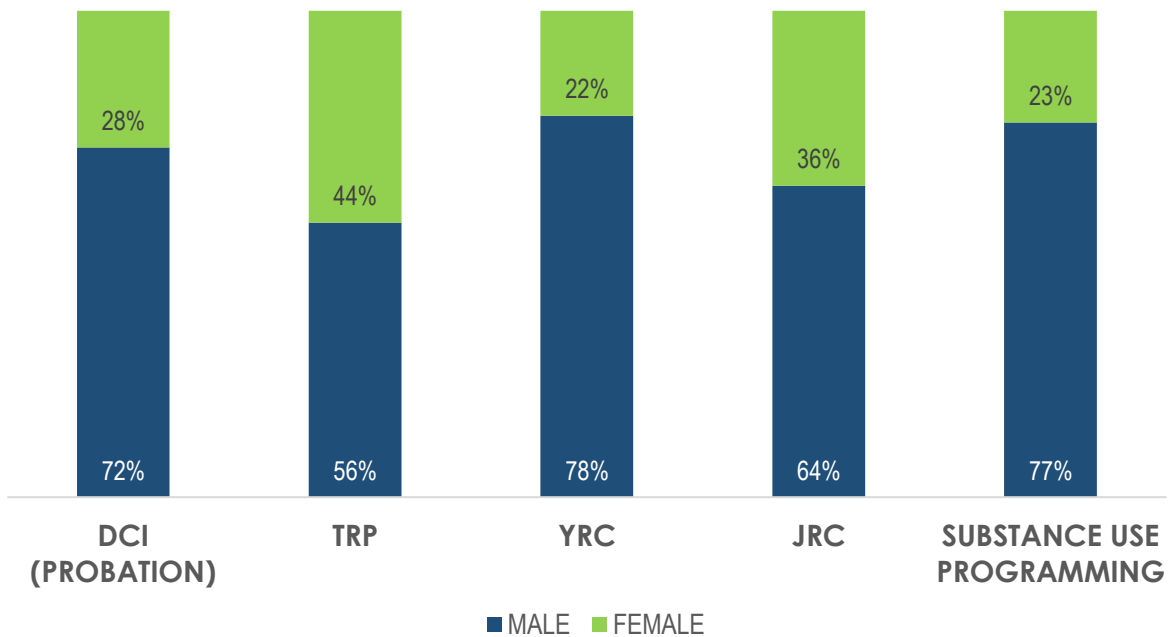
**Age of JJCPA Program Participants at Program Entry (in years)**

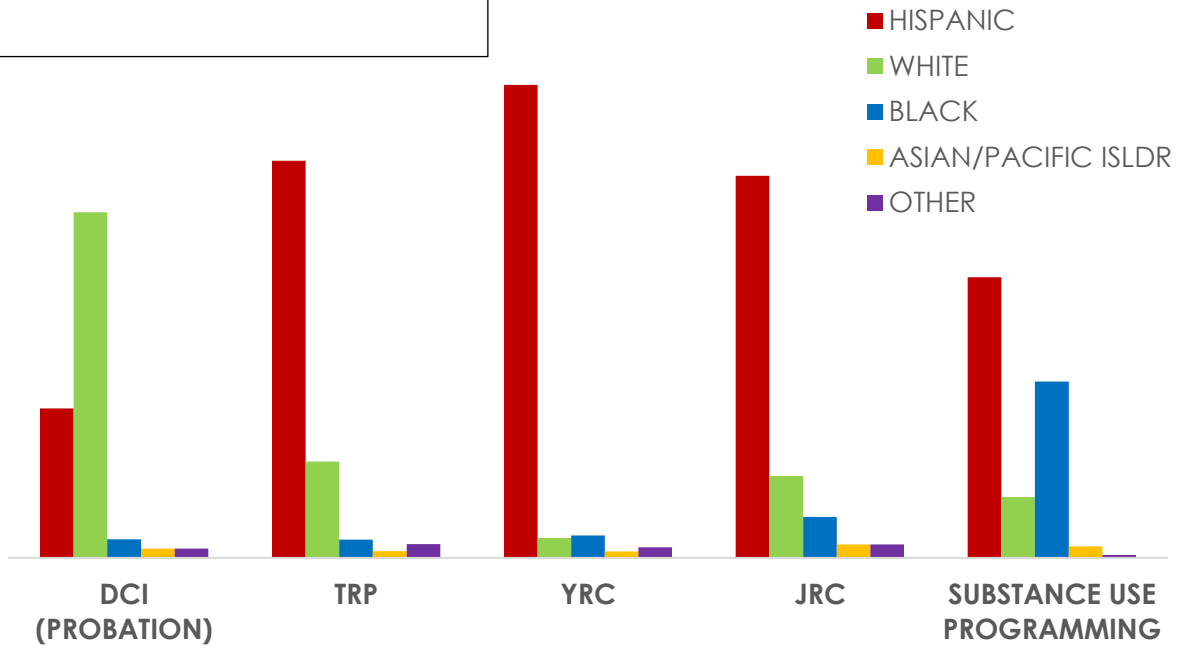
**Gender of JJCPA Program Participants**

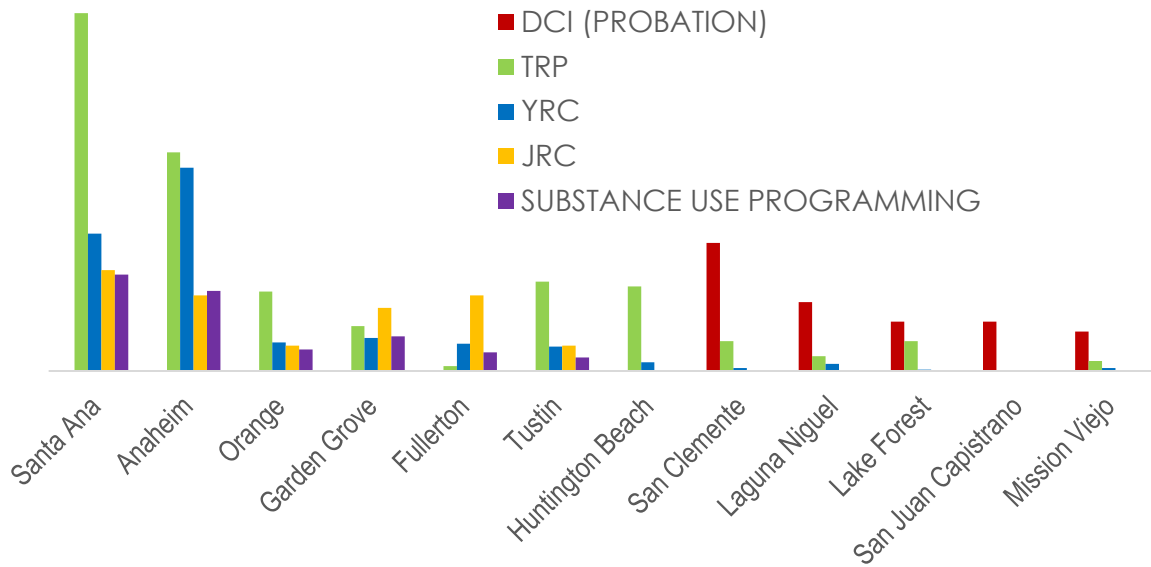
### Ethnicity of JJCPA Program Participants

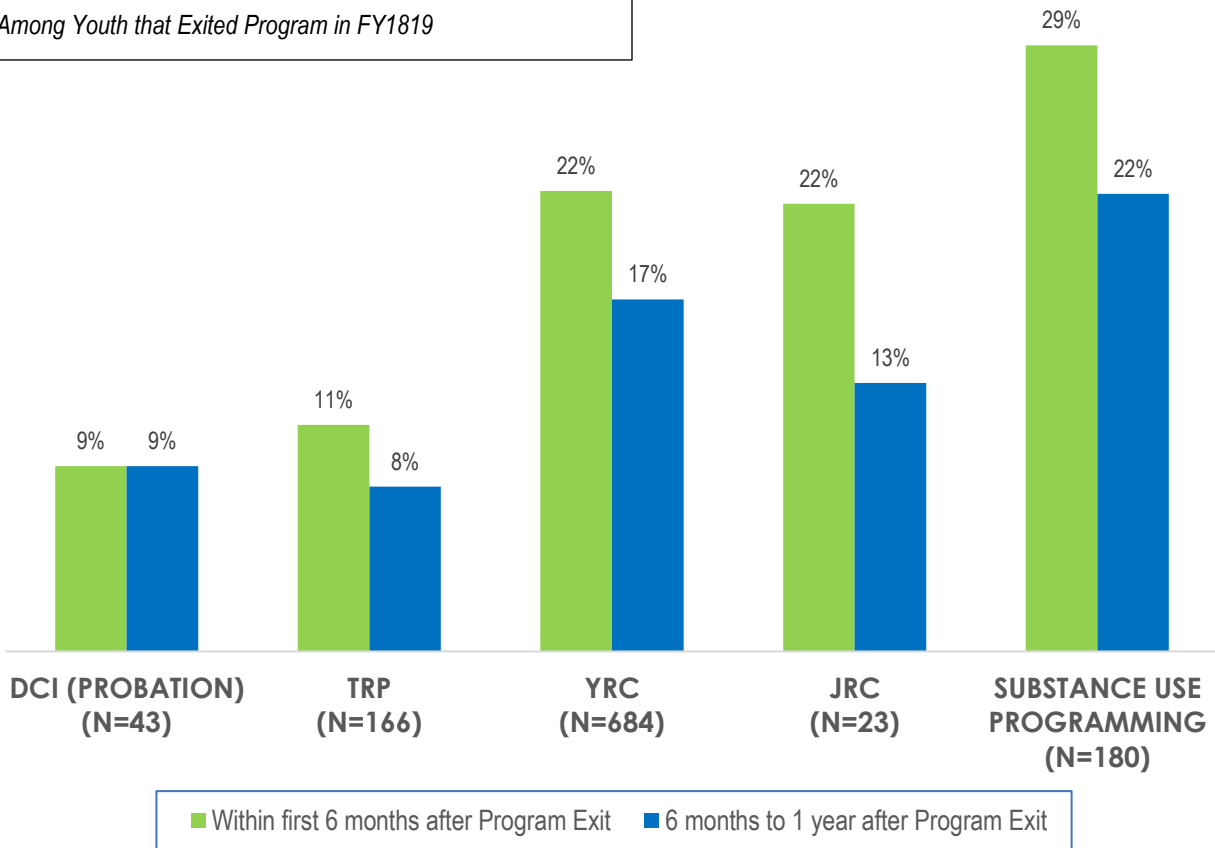
### Top Cities of Residence of JJCPA Program Participants
