AUTHORITY:	Section 1203 PC and Subsections, 1555.2PC, 1555.3PC and 1556 of the California Penal Code

FORMS:	Bench Warrant	(F057-2003(A)AF)
PURPOSE:	To establish guidelines for extradition in felony	cases.

- I. GENERAL INFORMATION
 - A. Cases Which May Merit Extradition
 - 1. The probationer imposed physical abuse on the victim.
 - 2. The probationer was convicted of dangerous or violent crimes.
 - 3. There are significantly large outstanding losses to victims.
 - 4. The probationer failed to serve initial custody time after being granted a stay.
 - 5. A substantial penalty is being recommended, i.e., state prison.
 - 6. Courtesy Supervision cases approved to reside outside of California.
 - B. Cases Which May Not Merit Extradition
 - 1. The probationer is being processed in another state for an offense more serious than the local violation activity.
 - 2. Because extradition is a costly, complicated process, it is seldom pursued in cases other than serious felonies.
 - 3. Misdemeanor cases, (with the exception of Courtesy Supervision cases).

II. PROCEDURE

- A. The assigned DPO reviews case facts with the unit SPO.
- B. The unit SPO consults with the Division Director.
- C. If the Division Director agrees that extradition should be recommended:
 - 1. The assigned DPO reviews the case with the Deputy District Attorney responsible for extradition matters.

- 2. If the Deputy District Attorney approves extradition, the assigned DPO indicates the following information on the Superior Court Bench Warrant (F0502-2021):
 - a. Following "Extradition:" indicate "yes."
 - b. Following "Additional Information:" indicate the name of the Deputy District Attorney with whom the case file was discussed and the reasons in support of extradition.
- 3. The District Attorney's Office prepares a written application for the return of the probationer and presents it to the Governor.
