CONTROL OF WEAPONS, AMMUNITION, AND EXPLOSIVES IN FACILITIES

AUTHORITY: Section 871.5 Welfare and Institutions Code

Administrative Directive

RESCINDS: Procedure Manual Item 3-2-005, dated 08/18/23 (Recertified)

FORMS: Special Incident Report

PURPOSE: To establish a procedure for safely securing weapons, ammunition and

explosives on the premises of juvenile facilities.

I. GENERAL INFORMATION

- A. Weapons, ammunition or explosives are not to be brought onto the premises of any facility by staff, youth, parents, other visitors or peace officers. To do so is a violation of Section 871.5 of the Welfare and Institutions Code.
- B. The only exceptions must be authorized by facility administration or would involve a peace officer who has been called to the facility, with the authorization of facility administration or designee, to investigate a serious disturbance, a break-in, a prowler or other emergency, at which time they may carry their weapon in the performance of their duty.
- C. A formal notice will be posted at each facility entrance and other vantage points to notify those who enter of the prohibition.

II. PROCEDURE

A. Weapons

- 1. Instruct peace officers or others who may be expected to carry a handgun in the execution of their duties to leave all weapons in a locked compartment of their patrol car or in a locked secure area at the facility. (Gun lockers are available at each facility.)
- 2. In the event parents or other visitors who are in possession of a weapon attempt to enter the premises:

- b. Contact supervisory or administrative staff immediately. They will determine the need to contact for assistance if they have not already been summoned.
- 3. If a parent or other visitor is discovered to be in possession of a handgun or other weapon while on the premises:

- a. will be contacted immediately for assistance and informed of the nature of the request, i.e., visitor with a weapon, preferably out of the hearing of visitors and youth. Staff will attempt to
- b. Contact the supervisor, Duty Officer (DO) or Administrator in Charge (AIC) immediately after contacting
- c. Upon the arrival of the DO or AIC will make the determination whether to will seize the weapon from the visitor or assume control of the weapon if previously seized by and determine if an arrest is appropriate.
- d. Involved staff will complete Special Incident Reports (SIRs) and the on-scene supervisor, DO or AIC will obtain any reports.
- e. The facility Division Director/designee will determine if the visitor is able to enter the facility at a later date.
- 4. If a youth is found to be in possession of a weapon:
 - a. Exercise extreme care and do not risk harm to self or others.
 - b. Contact a supervisor, confiscate the weapon, tag it with the youth's name, P/J/DL# number and name of the staff who confiscated the weapon. Place the weapon in an evidence locker.
 - c. If it is apparent that confiscation of the weapon is likely to become hazardous, the supervisor will
 - d. The AIC will be contacted for directions. The AIC will notify Executive Management (EM) via the chain of command.

B. Explosives

- 1. If explosives are discovered on the premises of a facility:
 - a. Take immediate steps to contain the area, i.e., evaluate the need to evacuate youth or staff from the immediate area to another location in the facility if possible.
 - b. Contact OCSD to remove/dispose of the explosives.
 - c. Staff will not make any attempt to move explosives prior to arrival of OCSD.

C. Report

- 1. In any situation where weapons, ammunition or explosives are found within the facility or on its grounds, the discovering staff (and others as necessary) will complete an SIR.
- 2. Forward the report to the facility Division Director. The facility Division Director/designee will notify EM via chain of command.
