#### SUMMARY OF ATTACHMENTS TO AGENDA ITEM #1

#### FY 12-13 Proposed AB 109 Allocation - REVISED 8/30/12 [Attachment #1]

Attachment #1 is a revised version of Attachment #3, FY 12-13 Proposed Allocation – ORIGINAL. Attachment #1 differs from the original version presented to the CCP on July 26, 2012 in that it reflects an increased allocation to Local Law Enforcement (LLE), offset by a reduction to the HCA Risk Pool/Stop Gap Insurance amount and Sheriff's one-time funding for Deputy Recruitment/Academies. Should the CCP approve the 3% allocation requested by LLE, any unspent monies will not carry forward to future fiscal years.

#### Local Law Enforcement PCS Funding Proposal (3%) [Attachment #2]

Local Law Enforcement (LLE) requested that the FY 12-13 3% allocation be distributed to individual LLE agencies based on OC Probation PCS Monthly Stats reported for October 1, 2011 through June 30, 2012. Should the CCP approve the 3% allocation, the funding will be distributed as reflected in Attachment #2 after submittal, review and approval of expenditure claims. Attachment #2 reflects the maximum amount to be allocated to each agency for eligible expenditures as determined by a Memorandum of Understanding to be established between the County of Orange and each LLE agency.

#### FY 12-13 Proposed AB 109 Allocation – ORIGINAL 7/26/12 [Attachment #3]

Attachment #3 is the original allocation proposal submitted to the CCP on July 26, 2012. The CCP approved the continuation of consideration of this item to a future meeting, which is scheduled for August 30, 2012.

#### Local Law Enforcement PCS Funding Proposal (2.4%) [Attachment #4]

Should the CCP choose to approve the original proposal presented at the July 26, 2012 meeting, rather than the revised proposal, Attachment #4 reflects the distribution of funds to each of the Local Law Enforcement agencies. Should the CCP approve the originally proposed allocation, the funding will be distributed as reflected in Attachment #4 after submittal, review and approval of expenditure claims. Attachment #4 reflects the maximum amount to be allocated to each agency for eligible expenditures as determined by a Memorandum of Understanding to be established between the County of Orange and each LLE agency. The original proposal allowed for the carryover of unspent LLE funds to FY 13-14.
