

Overview:

- PC §1170 Sentences: Of the 1,788 sentences during 12-month period, 60% (1,079) were split sentences and 40% (709) were straight county jail sentences.
- In-Custody Pre Trial Population: As of April 2014, in-custody pre trial population is 53% (47.5% felony and 5.5% misdemeanor).
- Rehabilitation Programs: Drug Court, DUI Court, Mental Health Court, and Veterans Treatment Court.
- **Resentencing Inventory (Proposition 36):** 171 Petitions filed to date with 85 resulting in resentencing, 26 denied or withdrawn
