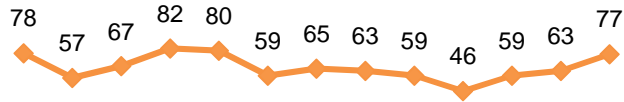

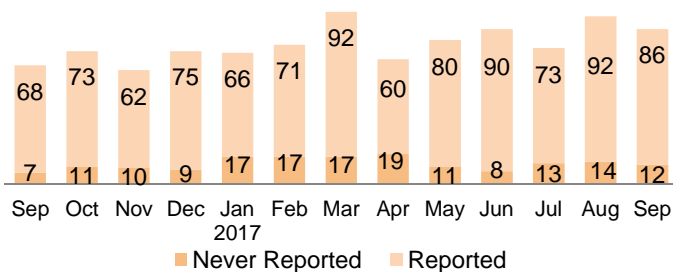

38.74% of individuals had at least one warrant issued since 10/1/2011.

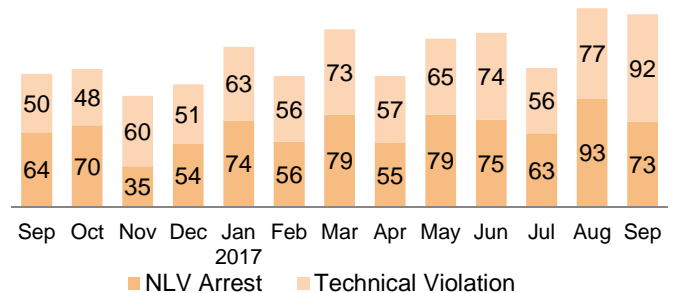


Revocations

43.33% of individuals had at least one revocation issued since 10/1/2011.

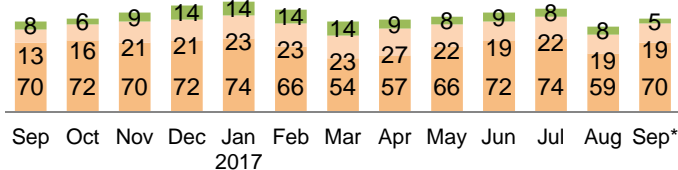


Day Reporting Center Participants

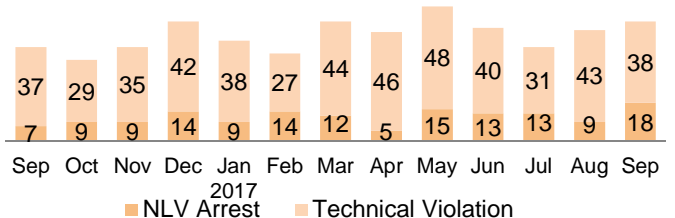

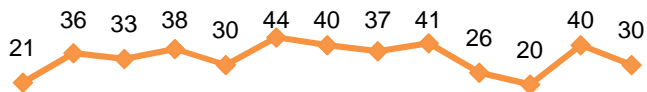
